








Battle/Event	Represented by ...	Significance
		These were the <u>first battles</u> of the American Revolution. At these battles, the first shots were fired, and it was known as “The Shot Heard Around the World.”
		This battle was the <u>turning point</u> of the American Revolution. It was a Patriot victory, and it convinced the French to join the war and help the Americans defeat the British.
		This is the name of the <u>camp site</u> where George Washington stationed his army during the winter of 1777. While they camped, Washington trained his men to become a professional army.

	 	<p>This individual is known as the "Father of the U.S. Navy." He was very successful at sea against the British navy. He was known for his bravery, and the quote, "I have not yet begun to fight."</p>
	 	<p>This was the <u>last major battle</u> of the American Revolution. As an act of surrender, the British General was required to surrender his sword to George Washington.</p>
		<p>This document officially ended the Revolutionary War. In this document, Great Britain recognized the United States as an independent country that extended from the Atlantic Ocean to the Mississippi River.</p>
